Height x Width: 2.5 x 1.5 m

Habit: Upright habit and very late flowering especially when pruned.

Stems & leaves: Strong brown very upright stems that are densely covered with very large mid-green glossy leaves that are neatly arranged on the stems and with a tendency to hang down all at the same angle looking quite attractive, like green tiles on a roof.

Panicles: The large panicles 250 x 200 mm are held erect at the ends of the stems. They have small clusters of creamy white fertile flowers overlain with 30% cover of medium sized white sterile flowers that become slightly pink on the reverse of the sepals at the very end of the season.

Overall assessment: The panicles are not particularly impressive but it does flower when all the other cultivars have finished. There appears to be at least two different forms in cultivation, one more compact and with more attractive paler green and larger leaves and the other more vigorous with smaller and darker green leaves.

Origins: Bred by Robert & Jelena De Belder, in 1967 at the Kalmthout Arboretum, in Belgium from a seedling of 'Tardiva'.
